- The article describes how the staff and patients worked in partnership to discuss and prevent falls.
- The model they used was to engage the patient, communicate with them, provide an opportunity to inquire and ask questions, and reward by providing a certificate on discharge. Consider whether this model can be used with patients in SPHM.
- The program led to 2 consecutive months without any patient falls.

Making Safe Patient Handling and Mobility Training Effective. Part 1. What to Teach, Where and When to Teach It and How to Teach It

- It is important to understand the difference between training and education.
- Define who and on what individuals need to be trained on.
- Consider different approaches to providing the information based upon what you know the learners need to know, different learning styles, generational differences in learning.
- Training for adults needs to be relevant and immediately applicable.
- Problem-solving learning is very effective.
- Online training is an option but do not overuse it.
- The biggest challenge is determining the where and when of training. You may not get the time or the location you want.
